Description of the Proposed Project [24 CFR 58.32; 40 CFR 1508.25]: It is estimated that approximately \$52,873,043 of CDBG-DR funds will be used to fund the activity delivery costs associated with Infrastructure programs.

Activity delivery costs (ADCs) are defined as allowable costs incurred for implementing and carrying out eligible CDBG-DR activities. All ADCs must be allocable to a CDBG-DR activity. 


National Flood Hazard Layer FIRMette
